
Not yet satisfied with his efforts and to investigate the matter further, he embarked upon this

(C) The Yogic Secrets of Mount Kailas Full view of Mount Kailas from Chiu Compa near Lake Manasarovar



Did you know...?

- Mount Kailas and Lake Mansarovar are situated in Tibet (now a part of China).
- Kailas Manasarovar region is in the north of Himalayas and consists of the twin lakes Manasarovar (lake of Mind) and Rakshas Tal (Devil's lake).
- Hindus speak of Mount Kailas as Siva's throne who sits with his consort Goddess Parvati. Indian scriptures tell that Mount Kailas is approachable by us mortals as it is on planet earth. While abodes of other Trinity i.e. Lord Brahma (Brahmalok) and Lord Vishnu (Vaikunth or Vishnulok) lay in heaven and are unapproachable by human beings.
- From the centre of paradise of the world (Kailas-Manasarovar region), four rivers also originate geographically forming a watershed where cosmic geometric energy pervades. From the east originates, Langchen Khambab which means 'Elephant's mouth' or river Sutlej (Shatadru), while from west, Senge Khambab (River from the Lion's mouth) or Indus (Sindhu). From the north, Mapchu Khambab (River from the mouth of a Peacock) or say Karnali and from the south originates Tamchok Khambab (River from Horse's mouth) or Brahmaputra. All rivers exhaust into Bay of Bengal and Arabian Sea while traveling hundreds of kilometers through different regions of the Central Asia.
- The year 2014 was the year of 'Horse' according to Tibetan system. Horse year is very auspicious year to perform Kora. Horse year comes after every 12 years and next Horse year will take place in 2026. This year long astronomical event is known as 'The Great Horse Festival' at Mount Kailas and starts from 'Saga Dewa' festival. According to Kalachakara Tantra, Godsang Gonpo introduced the system of Kora in a 'Horse' year. It is considered that Kailas became a power place in this year. Horse year is Maha Kumbh Mela at Mount Kailas just like Hindus celebrate the Kumbh Mela at Haridwar, Allahabad and Nasik etc. in India after every 12 years on revolving basis. Performing Kora around Mount Kailas in a Horse year gives benefit of 13 Koras in any other year.
- The legend of the source of the river Ganges descending from heaven to Mount Meru turns out to be a myth!! The river flowing from Meru is Darchung or Uma which merges in Rakshas Tal. River Bhagitrathi and Alaknanda are often cited as Ganges. Its origin is from Gaumukh near Gangotri in Uttarakhand. However, the origin of the Ganges is in close proximity to river Karnali which is one of the Gange's main tributaries originating from Tibet. River Karnali originates from the south of the Rakshas Tal and flows south-east of Mount Gurla Mandhata. It touches Purang (Taklakot) along with all the tributaries originating from Mount Gurla Mandhata. From Purang, river Karnali moves to Khojernath (last destination in Tibet) and flows into northwest of Nepal. There it converges with other tributaries of the river Karnali and enters India. In India, it is called river Ghaghra and merges with Ganges at Patna. We cannot trace the origin of Ganges nor can we find any obvious connection between the Ganges and Kailas as per Puranic accounts but, of course, Ganga remains Mother Ganga. Hindus worship Ganga as holy Goddess and its greatness is unparallel to other rivers.







The origin of creation is shrouded in mystery. The advent of the silvery Mount Kailas from earth's crust was also not witnessed by human being. But as per geological facts, Himalayas and silvery Mount Kailas, millions of years ago, lay under the tropical sea of Tethys and through some geological process the land arose to form mountains. Kailas and Manasarovar are as old as the creation itself. Mount Kailas is also called Swayambhu: 'the self-created'.

The sacred mountain is the 'Navel of the earth' and 'Axis Mundi'. Although its summit is of 22028 ft and cannot compete with other snowy peaks in the Himalayan range but its neighboring mountains cannot dwarf its beauty. The snow-clad pyramid mountain is seated on lotus-shaped and its subordinate holy mountains- Ravana, Hanuman, Padmasambhava, Manjushri, Vajradhara, Avalokiteswara, Jambeyang, Shavari & Norsing are as its vigilant sentinels.

Rising in Asia at Gangdise, Trans Himalaya, west Tibet, Mount Kailas has mythology, yogic and geographical significance. Mount Kailas has its other name Meru, Sumeru, Sushumna, Hemadri (golden mountain), Ratnasanu (jewel peak), Karnikachala (lotus mount), Amaradri, Deva Prvatha (summit of gods), Gana Parvatha, Rajatadri (silver mountain).

Four religions (Hinduism, Buddhism, Jainism and Bonpoism) approach sacred Mount Kailas to attain salvation. Several inquisitive people from other parts of world also visit it out of wonder and curiosity.



Hindu speaks of it as Siva's throne who sits with his consort Goddess Parvati. Buddhist knows it as abode of Demchhog (God of asceticism and tantrism). He is always mutually interlocked with Dorje Phakmo the yum or divine consort. Jain consider it where there founder Tirthankaras (Saviours) Rishabanatha had dropped mortal frames, ascending to their final abode. And for Bonpo, it is Naro BonChung.

Mount Kailas is also a natural structure on the earth that holds within a great secret of human life. Different religions speaks in different ways but the Divine message encoded in Mount Kailas is — 'KNOW THYSELF'

If a printed dictionary is consulted for the three-letter word GOD, it will not just give one meaning. Even three persons of different personas will have a number of self-contradictory definitions. All though gods may be many but the world they govern is one. The truth about many-in-one and one-in-many is not the product of any intellectual speculation, but conscious verification by countless sages, who had the potential to rise to that level.

GOD is within us. I live, yet not I, but God lives in me. The Bible says, 'We are made in the image of God'. Indian scripture identified man as a miniature replica of God... 'As the microcosm, so is the macrocosm'.

The spiritual masters believed that we have a spiritual core within us created by a higher power. They always propagate this principle and urge upon the people to connect with the divine within.

In Bhagavad Gita, the meaning of Meru has been interpreted beyond an actual mountain. It is where mortal and eternal meet and the omnipresent and intangible Divine take physical form, 'meru sikhramaham' translates to....'In mountains, I (Supreme Lord) am Meru (Kailas). It is a replica of Supreme.

It is also very clear in Shiv Samhita, (another Indian scripture) which explains Meru/Kailas as

देहेष्मिन् वर्तते मेरूः सप्त द्वीप समन्वितः।

deheshmin vartate meru sapt dweep smanvitah'

Explanation- Meru (Kailas) appears within man himself. In human body, Mount Meru (Kailas) is encircled by seven continents and he alone, who knows this, is to be a true yogi.

If we assess an archaic attempt made by Indian scriptures who have interpreted 'Meru within man him self', 'Replica of Supreme' then where does the imprints of the Mount Meru (Kailas) exist in the human body. It is either brain or heart. The Mahabharta also describes Meru – 'A kingdom of Mind'. The seat of Kailas as inner image of Divine or Eternal Truth can be in mind or brain which connects to the whole body and the brain functions like a control room. All our emotions and feelings also emanate from the mind itself. Mind can only make us aware of anything whether it is tiny insect or Super God. Heart is a physical organ which regulates blood circulation in the body.
